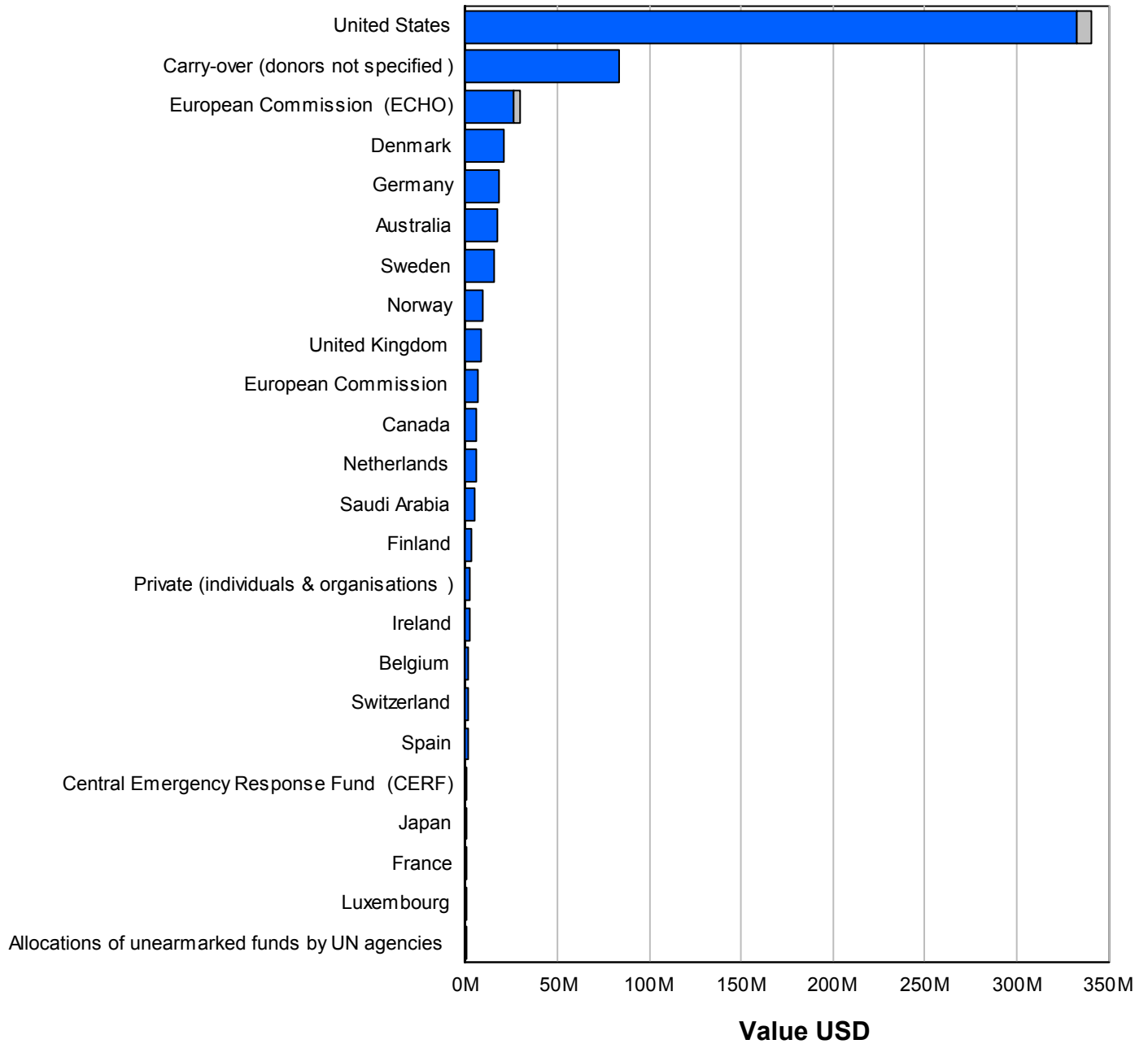
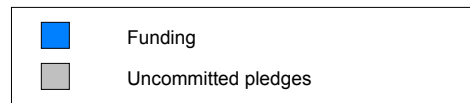

Contribution: the actual payment of funds or transfer of in-kind goods from the donor to the recipient entity.
